

2009 Summer Sailing Scholarship Requirements

These requirements are for the manner that FRMEA/LTYC will distribute scholarships for sailing programs. Programs must have US Sailing Level One Certified instruction staff.

GOALS

1. Distribute scholarship funds in a financially responsible manner.
2. Distribute scholarship funds fairly.
3. Reward member participation.
4. Encourage new members to participate in club activities.
5. Maintain new members who join for scholarship money.

PRIORITY

1. LTYC members child
2. LTYC members grandchild
3. LTYC members relative
4. Non-member

*Tie breaker will be the level of activity engaged in by LTYC member

FINANCIAL COMMITMENT BY FRMEA/LTYC

Financial commitment provided by FRMEA/LTYC will be based on the cost of membership. The financial commitment will be a graduated scale taking into consideration the length of applicant's membership in FRMEA/LTYC and level of participation in FRMEA/LTYC events. The maximum financial commitment will be the total cost of the selected program or an amount determined by the FRMEA/LTYC Board of Directors.

Length of Membership	Financial Commitment
1. One year or less:	50% of cost of membership
2. Two to Five years:	75% of cost of membership
3. Five to Ten years:	100% of cost of membership
4. Over Ten years:	125% of cost of membership
5. Board Member (past/present)	150 % of cost of membership

Level of Participation

1. Each event attended by the club member adds \$50.00 to the scholarship.
2. Each event that the club member assists in (ex. Cooks, plans, cleans, setup, serves) adds \$75.00 to the scholarship.
3. Currently there are six events to participate in as well as fifteen Thursday night race dinners:
 - a. St. Patrick's Day Dinner
 - b. Semi Annual Meeting Pot Luck Dinner
 - c. Pancake Breakfast
 - d. Steak Out ~ Auction
 - e. Hawaiian Night
 - f. Annual Meeting Pot Luck Dinner
